## General Welfare Consolidated Check Distributions Change

Due to changes in benefit volume from applicants, the General Resources Department will be changing the distribution dates for monthly benefits. Elders will receive their benefit as regularly scheduled on the 20th of each month. All other adult members will receive their benefit on the 23rd of the month. In the event your distribution date lands on a weekend or a holiday the benefit will go out the business day before the weekend or closure.

## Administration Updates

All Tribal events hosted by the General Resources and Culture departments are cancelled or postponed for the remainder of the year due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. We look forward to hosting events when it is safe to do so in 2022.

Please look out for emails regarding ticket distributions for Seahawks, Kraken, and special concert events. All tickets are currently digital and require you to have an email and a Ticketmaster account. If you do not plan to attend please do not claim or accept your tickets email as it makes it very difficult for the department to reverse the transfer.

**Climate Pledge Arena:** Kraken games and all concerts at this venue require proof of vaccination via the CLEAR app which can be located on the Climate Pledge arena's web page under COVID-19 protocols.

**Lumen Field:** Seahawks games at this venue require proof of vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours of the game start.

Tribal Administration will be closed November 11 for Veteran's Day and November 25-26 for Thanksgiving Break. These closures will affect benefit processing deadlines. Please have all applications submitted to the General Resources Department by November 15 to ensure processing prior to Thanksgiving.

Tribal Administration will be closed starting December 24, 2021 for Christmas Break. Please have all benefit applications submitted to the General Resources Department by December 17 to ensure processing prior to the closure.

## General Welfare Consolidated Changes

Tribal Council approved a waiver to delay annual recertification until Fall 2022 due to the ongoing pandemic and lack of access to printers, computers, and scanners for Tribal Members. However, if you move, change insurance carriers, age into Elder status (55+), or would like to change your benefit elected amounts, then you must submit a new application with supporting documents to the General Resources Department or [generalresources@snoqualmietribe.us](mailto:generalresources@snoqualmietribe.us)
