Subject: Registration Opening for NEW Snoqualmie Indian Tribe Child Development Center

Dear Families,

As many of you are aware, Bright Horizons is partnering with the Snoqualmie Indian Tribe to open a new child care center in early 2023. Registration opens today for the new center and we're here to assist your family with the process as a family already enrolled with Bright Horizons. If your family is interested in transferring your child's enrollment to the new center, please let me know before September 30 so that we can begin the process in the Family Information Center for you to register at the new center.

In October, enrollment interest for the new center will be assessed and enrollment spaces will be allocated based on the following priority grouping:

- Priority 1 – Native Families (must have a parent enrolled in a U.S. Federally recognized Tribe)
- Priority 2 – Children of Employees of the Snoqualmie Tribe, Crescent Market, Snoqualmie Casino, Eighth Generation, and Salish Lodge & Spa
- Priority 3 – Snoqualmie Valley Community at large

The Tribe operates the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) grant to assist Native families with access to high quality child care and early learning opportunities. The CCDF grant can assist eligible Native families with registration fee assistance and monthly subsidized tuition. To apply for grant funding please fill out a CCDF application from the Tribe's website under General Benefits or email childcare@snoqualmietribe.us for a copy.
