



SNOQUALMIE INDIAN TRIBE

K-12 BENEFIT APPLICATION

The Snoqualmie Indian Tribe has established the K-12 Benefit Program to give Tribal children better access to educational opportunities by assisting Tribal families with K-12 education-related expenses. Proof of enrollment in school is required to be on file each year before funds are released unless homeschooling then you must declare you are homeschooling on this application and submit the proper declaration form to the school district in which you reside.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to receive this benefit, the child must be 1) an enrolled Snoqualmie minor, and 2) be receiving K-12 education.

HOMESCHOOLING

Definition of Homeschooling: Homeschooling is when parents or guardians act as full-time instructors and the child is not enrolled in a school. Homeschooling is not the same as distance learning or online schooling — also known as virtual school — in which a child is enrolled in a school which provides teachers who manage the student's studies virtually using a structured curriculum

Homeschool Applicants: Applicants with children who are homeschooled must submit with this application a pre-determined curriculum for the child's upcoming school year, curriculum can be submitted on a monthly, quarterly, each semester, or annual basis; the schedule should be established with the Education Department at time of initial application. The curriculum must meet tribal or state standards and include, at minimum, a rough estimate of expected expenses. The curriculum and expense estimate must be reviewed and approved by the Education Director before funding will be released. Changes throughout the year will not be accepted. The homeschooled child must complete and meet any testing and educational standards required by the state in which the child primarily resides, Kindergarteners are exempt from testing requirements. The Education Department reserves the right to assess curriculum to ensure age appropriateness in the event state standards are available for a given grade. Field trips for the purposes of homeschooling cannot be lavish or excessive, must be limited in number to be consistent to what would be offered in a traditional school setting, and must be directly tied to a portion of the submitted curriculum.

BENEFIT INFORMATION

An eligible child in grades Kindergarten through Grade 12 may receive up to \$15,000 per Tribal Academic Year to cover certain K-12 education expenses or to be used towards homeschooling expenses. The Tribal Academic Year, regardless of the student's school or program, begins on July 1 and concludes on June 30. This K-12 benefit is a discretionary benefit authorized by Tribal Council and subject to Tribal Council appropriations. Tribal Council reserves the right to alter or eliminate this benefit at any time. All requests must be dated within the current Tribal Academic Year to be considered for reimbursement or payment.



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ELIGIBLE EXPENSES

Category A: School tuition, Running Start program expenses, summer school, tutoring, private evaluation for the development of an IEP (individual education plan), or other supplemental educational support or educational enrichment classes, lessons or programs including but not limited to: tuition, fees, test prep, exam fees, school fees (ASB, class fees, parking pass), field trip fees, uniform fees, and all other required fees, books and supplies needed by the course or program.

- *Applicants for homeschooled children must have an approved curriculum on file. Only services or supplies directly tied to the approved curriculum will be considered eligible expenses.*

Up to \$3000 of this benefit per Tribal Academic Year may be used towards the following categories:

Category B: Club fees, activity fees, and sports fees. Student may be required to provide proof of enrollment in the course or program.

Category C: School spirit expenses: school logo gear, letterman's jackets, class rings, student admission to school events, and school photos.

Category D: Graduation expenses: cap, gown, tassel, announcements and other senior gear included in graduation announcement packages.

Category E: Technology and software costs, including Microsoft Office or similar, educational software, and technology equipment as required or recommended by a teacher, tutor, or school program. Technology and software costs, including Microsoft Office or similar, other educational software, and technology equipment as required or recommended by a teacher, tutor, homeschool need, or school program. Purchase of same/similar technology equipment is only allowed every 3 years. Laptops, desktops, ipads, tablets are all defined for the purposes of this program as similar items.

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STUDENT RELEASE OF INFORMATION FERPA (FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT) FORM

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, 34 C.F.R. Part 99 is a federal law that protects the privacy of financial and academic student education records. Generally, schools require have written permission from the parent or eligible student (if over 18 years of age) in order to release information from a student’s education record.

By signing, the applicant understands that the Snoqualmie Indian Tribe’s intent of collecting and maintaining this data is to determine eligibility for Tribal educational benefits and to provide a means of producing statistical records.
